Flying Dutchman



Cutting Instructions:


Background Fabric: Sixteen 3.5 inch squares

Fabric One: Four 3.5 x 6.5 inch rectangles

Fabric Two: Four 3.5 x 6.5 inch rectangles

Assembly Instructions:

Use your favourite way of creating a flying geese unit, ending with a unit that measures 3.5 x 6.5 inches.



Using a marking pen of your choice, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner of the 3.5 inch squares.


Layer one square on your rectangles as shown, and sew directly on the line.





Trim 1/4 inch away from your sewing line.

Important, you **MUST PRESS** this triangle open before sewing your next square on, otherwise your flying geese unit will not turn out correctly!



Follow the steps above to sew the second square on the unit. Ensure that when you fold back your square fabric, that your contrast fabric forms a large triangle.

Trim and press as directed in previous steps to end up with flying geese unit. Make a total of 8 of these units.



Decide on your layout:



Sew your geese into pairs:



Sew your pairs into rows, being sure to alternate the pressing of your seams. (I pressed towards the green triangles.)
